

CDM REGULATIONS 2015 SITE INDUCTION AND SUPERVISION ETC.



Contractors must provide each worker under their control with appropriate supervision, instructions and information so that construction work can be carried out without risks to health and safety.

The Principal Contractor or Contractor (on single contractor projects) must ensure a suitable Site Induction (SI) is provided to every site worker.

Site inductions should also be provided to those who do not regularly work on the site, but who visit it on an occasional (e.g. architects) or once-only basis (e.g. students). Inductions provided to escorted visitors need not have the detail that unescorted visitors should have. Escorted visitors only need to be made aware of the main hazards and control measures.

PROJECT DETAILS	
Provide an outline of the project details.	
COMMITMENT FROM THE TOP	
Explain how senior management of the business is committed to securing health and safety of everyone working on or affected by the project.	
MANAGEMENT AND SUPERVISION ARRANGEMENTS	
Explain how the project is to be managed to secure health and safety. Include arrangements for supervising the work and any specific arrangements e.g. for the young, inexperienced or those starting a new work activity.	
PARTICULAR RISKS AND CONTROL MEASURES	
Highlight any particular risks (including those listed in CDM Regulations 2015 Schedule 3) and control measures and welfare arrangements that those working on the project need to know about. Include information on risks identified by the risk assessments under Management Regulations or arising out of the conduct of another contractor's undertaking.	
PROCEDURES IN THE EVENT OF DANGER	
Explain the procedures to be followed in the event of serious and imminent danger to health and safety.	
FIRST AID	



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Describe the arrangements for first aid in the event of injury whilst working on site.	
ACCIDENTS AND INCIDENTS	
Explain the arrangements for reporting an accident and incidents which occur on the project.	
ON-GOING BRIEFINGS	
Explain the arrangements for briefing workers on an on-going basis e.g. toolbox talks, daily activity briefings	
CONSULTING WORKFORCE	
Explain the arrangements for consulting the workforce on health and safety matters.	
RESPONSIBILITIES OF ALL	
Explain individual worker responsibility for health and safety on the project.	
OTHER INFORMATION	
Inform of any other information necessary to enable the worker to comply with the relevant statutory provisions.
